INVITATION AND CALL FOR PAPERS

International Conference

NIKOLAI BERDIAEV AND UNITY OF THE EUROPEAN SPIRIT

27 September – 1 October 2006

In 2003, 2004 and 2005, St. Andrew's Biblical Theological Institute (Moscow) in cooperation with Ostkirchliches Institut, Regensburg and with the support of the Catholic Committee for Cultural Collaboration (Rome) organized a number of conferences on the problem of unity of European culture. Each of them was dedicated to one of the Russian Silver Age thinkers, in whose works this theme occupied an important place – Vladimir Soloviev, Sergey Bulgakov and Pavel Florensky. To continue this tradition, in 2006 St. Andrew's organizes an International Academic Theological Conference devoted to Nikolai Berdiaev – a prominent representative of Russian religious renaissance and also one of the most influential European thinkers of the first half of 20th century.

The Conference will take place in Moscow from Wednesday, 27 September to Sunday, 1 October 2006. Leading theologians, philosophers, and other specialists who made important contributions into scholarship of Russian and Western religious philosophy are invited. In the course of the Conference, the following questions will be addressed.

- 1. Freedom and compulsion: Berdiaev's ideas in the context of 20^{th} century.
- 2. Tragedy of the creative act and crisis of culture.
- 3. Philosophy of loneliness and communication.
- 4. Eschatological metaphysics of N. Berdiaev.
- 5. N. Berdiaev and existential-personalist tradition in 20th century philosophy
- 6. Freedom and the creative act in Christian reflection.
- 7. God-seeking in modern Russia: the lessons of N. Berdiaev.
- 8. West and East: a Russian project of universalism.
- 9. N. Berdiaev as a Russian and western thinker.

PAPERS AND PUBLICATION

Those who wish to present a paper should send a summary (1000 words at most) by e-mail to St. Andrew's by 1 July 2006. The Organizing Committee selects papers for the Conference and sends invitations to the speakers. The full text of all the papers selected will have to be submitted by 1 September 2006. However, it will be possible to participate without a paper (some priests, professors, and students are expected to be present). The working languages of the conference will be Russian and English.

Upon arrival at the conference every participant will receive summaries of all the papers presented and the conference program. Plenary and sectional papers are scheduled for 30 minutes each. Some

papers will be published in St Andrew's quarterly *Pages: Theology, Culture, Education* and we will publish a collection of papers in a separate volume. Summaries and papers should be sent to:
